Charlie Mays brought in a table from 1932 which he refinished at that time. He says never use sandpaper to remove the old finish, instead use a water based finish remover, that is thick almost a jelly consistency and a putty knife. Use multiple applications if necessary. Do not use sandpaper because you will ruin the patina of the wood.

Charlie's presentation was very informative and complete. He gave many tips for removing old finishes without damaging the piece.

Charlie also went over the process of applying the stain and finish back on the piece.

The table he showed during his presentation was stripped and refinished 41 years ago, and it looked brand new.
